The city of Aachen has a special atmosphere. Located on the border to Belgium and the Netherlands Aachen is Germany's most "European" city. Aachen has an excellent location and is not far away from many major European cities such as Cologne, Brussels, Amsterdam, Paris and London.

Aachen has a rich European history (it was once the capital of Carolus Magnus, Charlemagne), a unique, in summer Mediterranean charm, a rich academic life with special focus on science and technology, excellent travel connections by train and flight through Maastricht/Aachen, Frankfurt, Cologne/Bonn, Düsseldorf, Brussels Zaventem or Amsterdam Schipol.

The city of Aachen (Aix-la-Chapelle, Aquisgrán, Aquisgrana) belongs to the federal state of North-Rhine Westphalia and is the most westerly city in the Federal Republic of Germany. It is located in the triangle where Germany, the Netherlands, and Belgium meet.



Due to its location close to the border, Aachen has good transport connections. Aachen central station is a stop for many local and long-distance trains. The airports in the surroundings can be reached in a short time both by train and by car via the welldeveloped traffic network.

Short distances within the Aachen region can conveniently be covered by public transport; numerous bus services are available.




Ground Floor






Hotels in and around Aachen

Tour of the old town

The historic old town of Aachen invites to go for a stroll. Let yourself be guided through narrow alleys and across historic squares through the almost 2000 year-old history of Aachen. Experience all facets of Aachen, a modern city with beautiful historic town houses, many old and new fountains, and innumerable stories all about the cathedral and the town hall.

Tour of the town hall

In the 14th century the town hall of Aachen was built on the foundation walls of the Carolingian palace.

The neo-Gothic outside appearance and the baroque inside of the building are a reflection of its eventful history. Where at first Charlemagne during his imperial residence celebrated grandiose festivities, numerous crowned kings did the same in the crowning hall. Let yourself be guided trough a building, which today is the location for the famous International Charlemagne Prize and at the same time is the official residence of the Lord Mayor.



Tours and touristic attractions

Guided tour of the cathedral

Aachen cathedral is a special kind of World Heritage Site. The core of this building is more than 1200 years old. The former Palace Chapel of Charlemagne has developed into one of the most interesting cathedrals of Western Europe.

Visit to the "Printen" bakery Klein

The "Printe" is the "national biscuit" of Aachen. There are numerous variations: Hard and soft types of "Printen", with herbs or nuts, decorated with an icing, or covered with chocolate. On a visit to the "Printen" bakery Klein, you will learn everything about the famous Aachen speciality: What are the required ingredients? How is the dough prepared? How were "Printen" made in former times, and how are they made today?



Places of interest, cultural and leisure time attractions

Aachen can look back on 2000 years of eventful history. On the one hand, this past is reflected in the cityscape; in particular the old part of Aachen with its many small alleys and impressive sights is fascinating. On the other hand, it shows in its broad range of cultural attractions, including numerous architectural monuments and museums.

Cathedral (UNESCO World Heritage)

The Aachen cathedral is one of the most famous examples of occidental architecture. It is the coronation church of more than 30 German kings, burial site of Charlemagne, major pilgrimage church and cathedral church of the Aachen diocese since 1930. In 1978 it was the first German building to be included in the UNESCO World Heritage list. A guided tour is a "must" for anyone who loves historic buildings and churches.

Town hall

In the early 14th century, the citizens of Aachen took over the ruined palace of Charlemagne. On ist foundation they built the gothic town hall, which was converted into a baroque building during the 17th and 18th century. The town hall was seriously damaged in the two fires of 1656 and 1883 as well asduring Second World War. 50 statues of German rulers adorn the north facade; 31 of the kings represented were crowned in Aachen.


Ludwig Forum for International Art

The Ludwig Forum for International Art exhibits contemporary works of art. It is based on the collection by Peter and Irene Ludwig, which contains exemplary major works of American Pop-Art as well as Photorealism and the development of European art from the early sixties to the modern day. Couven-Museum

The Couven-Museum features the development of the bourgeois culture of living in the 18th and 19th century. It covers the following styles: Rococo, early classicism, empire style and Biedermeier period, Aachen Liège furniture of the 18th century, faiences, precious glass and porcelain. The Couven-Museum is located in a house built in 1778, which belonged to the old Aachen apothecary family of Monheim. Its current name stems from the famous Aachen architect Johann Joseph Couven (1701-1763).
